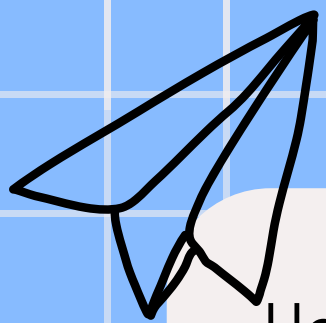
SOCIAL GATORS



SOCIAL Gators (Student Opportunities for Career, Independent, and Academic Life) is a support program for UF students with autism spectrum disorder and related disabilities who want to enhance their skills for a more enriching college experience.

- Collaborate with CARD and the DRC to help gators in developing skills in social interaction, independence, career readiness, and academics through: peer mentoring, weekly group meetings, structured dialogue, access to resources, and social connections.

- 1.) Get connected with the DRC
 - -Pre-register, and then the DRC will review your pre-registration form and assign you to an Accessibility Specialist
- 2.) Schedule and attend the initial appointment
- 3.) Receive your accommodations

Scholarships

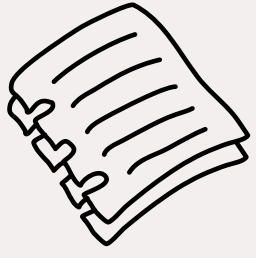
- THEODORE R. VIVIAN M. JOHNSON SCHOLARSHIP
 - A competitively awarded program, which is available to undergraduate students with disabilities enrolled in a State University System of Florida (SUS) institution
- M. SQUITIERI SCHOLARSHIP FUND
 - Evaluation: Christopher M. Squitieri Scholarship
 - This fund is available to provide an evaluation to any registered Disability Resource Center student who is enrolled in a degree-seeking program.
 - Technology: Christopher M. Squitieri Scholarship
 - This fund is available to provide an item of technology to any registered Disability Resource Center student who is enrolled in a degree-seeking program.
- DEB RICHARD FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP
 - Available to students with physical disabilities since birth who are enrolling at the University of Florida
- NEILSEN SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM
 - For undergraduate or graduate students with spinal cord injuries. Eliminates barriers to academic success for eligible students by providing funds to create and maintain opportunities to pursue an education in their chosen degree program and lead full lives in and out of the classroom
